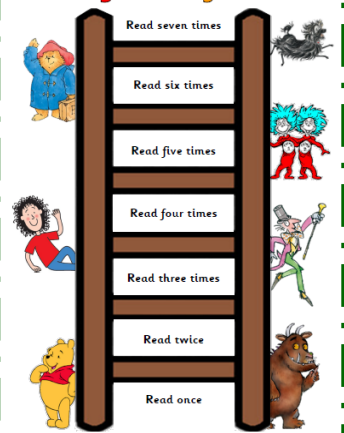
Dear parents and carers,

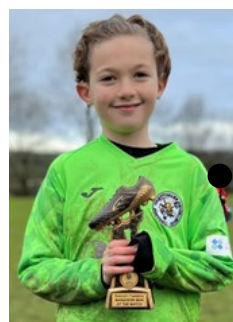

On Wednesday 25th January we went to the Town hall to meet with other school councilors and we talked about what we loved about Biddulph and how we could improve our town.

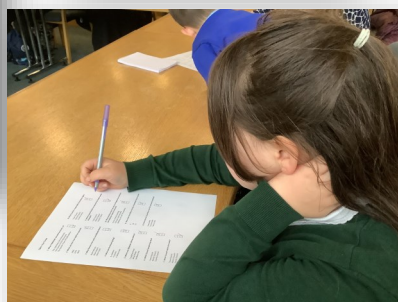
Things we loved:
