### We are proud to be part of the Little Heroes campaign.....

We are proud to be part of the Little Heroes Campaign here at Oxhey First School. Over the next few weeks we will be introducing the children to the Heroes campaign and modelling activities that could be used to support them in understanding the importance of school attendance but also offering advise and guidance on how to manage worries together.



#### School attendance

Attending school on a regular basis is the key to your child doing well at school and will set them up with good habits for later life. It will also give your child the opportunity to:

- Make friends and improve social interaction
- Learn new things and develop skills Increase confidence and self-esteem
- Have better career prospects
  Achieve their potential and fulfil their aspirations

#### **Absences**

Did you know? Absence disrupts the education of the individual pupil and whole class. Children who do not attend school regularly car

- Struggle to achieve well in exams
- Fall behind in class
- Find it difficult to maintain friendships Miss out on important and fun opportunities

#### What if my child doesn't want to go to school?

Some children are reluctant to attend school or look to their parents to provide them with an excuse. Never give in to pressure to let a child stay off school, it may make things worse

If you are experiencing problems, talking to your child's school is the best place to start. Don't be afraid to contact your child's teacher or head teacher - communicating is the first step to addressing the issue. Most problems can be resolved once the school is made aware of the situation.

#### What is the Little Heroes campaign?

We understand that for many families, getting their children to attend school can be a real challenge, and many children face significant barriers.

Staffordshire County Council have launched their school attendance campaign to support and encourage regular school attendance, with a strong focus on emotional health support.

# WHAT THE NEW RULES MEAN FOR ME

I'm a single parent of one child and we want to go on holiday for a week.

Your holiday will not be authorised and you must talk to the school before you book anything.

Because your child will miss 5 school days you will be given a penalty notice fine.

The fine is £160 but if you pay it in 21 days it will be reduced to £80.

#### FOR EVERY CHILD A PENALTY IS GIVEN.

Reduced to £320 if paid in 21 days

# IRREGULAR ATTENDANCE

If your child is absent for 10 or more sessions in 10 weeks and their absences are unauthorised. The school will consider prosecution.

Reduced to £640 if paid in 21 days

If in any period of not more than 3 years, your child has a 2nd and 3rd leave of absence or pattern of irregular attendance...



#### **2ND TIME**

2 parents and

1 child = £320

2 children = 640 3 children = 960

4 children = 1280

No discount for early payment



#### **3RD TIME**

A penalty notice fine will not be given. Instead, your case will be taken to court.

A magistrate can fine each parent £2500 for each child

1 parent & 4 children = £10,000 2 parents & 4 children = £20,000
