

Until recently, the law did not require a business to recycle; it was a choice. But now the law is changing. From **31st March 2025**, all business premises **must** arrange to have all:

- dry recyclable waste (glass, cans, plastic, paper and card) collected for recycling;
-) food waste separately collected for recycling.



ATTENDANCE WHAT THE NEW RULES MEAN FOR ME



If in any period of not more than 3 years, your child has a 2nd and 3rd leave of absence or pattern of irregular attendance...

2ND TIME

2 parents and 1 child = £320 2 children = 640 3 children = 960 4 children = 1280 No discount for early payment



3RD TIME

A penalty notice fine will not be given. Instead, your case will be taken to court. A magistrate can fine each parent £2500 for each child 1 parent & 4 children = £10,000 2 parents & 4 children = £20,000
